



Bidding Prayer

Led by Celebrant

In the name of God, who has delivered us from the dominion of darkness and made a place for us in the kingdom of his beloved Son, we welcome you: grace to you and peace.

As we meet to celebrate anew the coming of God's kingdom, we hear revealed the mystery of God's loving purpose for us – how that when we were far off, he met us in his Son and brought us home; how he humbled himself to take our human nature, that we might share his divine glory.

Let us then so celebrate this coming with our carols and hymns of praise, that our lives may be charged with his life; that we may bear witness to his glory and so bring light to those who sit in darkness. So first we pray for those among whom the Christ was born: the poor and helpless, the aged and young children; the cold, the hungry and the homeless; the victims of poverty, injustice and oppression, the sick and those who mourn, the lonely and the unloved; those in despair or in the shadow of death.

Then, as we hear again the message of peace on earth and goodwill among all his people, we pray for the leaders of the nations, that all may be inspired to work together for the establishment of justice, freedom and peace the world over.

And that we may bear true witness to this hope in a divided world, we pray for the peace and unity of Christ's Body, the Church universal, that the whole earth may live to praise his name.

Finally, as we rejoice with the saints in heaven and on earth, we remember all who have gone before us with the sign of faith, whose hope was in the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we offer up our prayers for the coming of his kingdom, in the words he himself has taught us, let us say together:

Our Father in Heaven

hallowed be your name, your kingdom your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

Advent Moments

"Mary remained with Elizabeth about three months and then returned home." *Luke 1: 56*

What thoughts went through Mary's mind while she stayed with her cousin Elizabeth? Surely, she felt changes taking place. She must have noticed movement in the quiet sanctuary of her womb. Three months...but in many ways time stood still for Mary as she waited upon this mystery of new life.

Yet, this was only the beginning. Throughout her life Mary would wonder about her child, would live with mystery, again and again. The waiting would continue in the quiet of her heart, where she would ponder the meaning of this special life.

What calmed her fears and gave her courage while she waited? Mary believed that she was a part of something greater than herself...a larger plan...a vital part of the Mystery. Today, we call it salvation. Mary did not have a name for it, but that did not stop her from believing.

All-powerful God, your eternal Word took flesh on our earth when the Virgin Mary placed her life at the service of your plan. Lift our minds in watchful hope to hear the voice which announces his glory and open our minds to receive the Spirit who prepares us for his coming. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Youth Corner

Luke 1: 39 – 55

"Dear God, help us to "wonder" today – at the people you choose to do your work, including us. Amen."

In today's Bible story, we hear Mary (soon-to-be mother of the not-yet-born-baby-Jesus) say that her soul *magnifies* God. In other words, Mary is saying that she's seeing certain things about God very well. She then says what some of those things are that she's seeing about God. She says she sees the mercy and strength that God offers.

She sees how God lifts up those, who, like herself, are feeling lowly. She sees how God fills those who are hungry with good things. And guess what? By saying and sharing these things that she sees about God, she's helping to magnify God for the rest of us – she's helping us to see God better!

And she's not the only one who magnifies God for the rest of us. After Jesus is born and grows up, we see him do the same thing as his mom does in today's story – he speaks and acts in ways that help us better see who God is.

As we listen to and read the stories of people who magnify God – like Jesus, his disciples, his mom (Mary), his cousin (John the Baptist), etc., then we are learning how to better see who God is. And the better we see God, the more we can be like Mary in today's story – where we can be magnifiers of God by sharing what we see of God which then helps others see God better.

"Thank you, God, for always finding ordinary people to do your work. Help us to see the important work you have for each of us. Amen."
